Our History

The area we utilize is known today as the Edgewood Oak Brush Plains Preserve. It has come a long way over the years and the Edgewood Flyers have been a part of it since the beginning and have played a great role.

Years before the demolition of the abandoned Edgewood Hospital, many modelers from the area flew behind this building. This area was taken over by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). Once the building was demolished, several interested parties who wished to use this area, pursued a formal venue to establish the "Edgewood Flyers."

A small group approached the DEC and explained our purpose and goals. The DEC gave us a section to utilize. We had been given an area to utilize, basically where the hospital used to stand. We looked around and there was nothing but sand, construction material, pieces of coal residue and debris. We cleaned it up and fixed it to establish an area for our family pass time.

For many years this property had been neglected. Throughout the 70's, 80's and 90's we played a vital role as good ambassadors of this area. It was a dumping ground for many. It was not a safe place. Vandals and illegal activity was prominent. The Edgewood Flyers family oriented activity and cleanup efforts started to change things. Our presence became a deterrent for illegal activity and dumping. We helped the DEC in there efforts to catch many.

Over the last few years, we have seen a more family orientated area. We see families walking, joggers, biking, and many others. The Edgewood Flyers have been the longest user of the preserve. The Edgewood Flyers are, also, by far the largest group as well as the biggest user of the preserve. We represent almost 200 families with over 400 people involved with our passion. Fathers, Mothers, and children all come out and have a great time.

Our club and activity has been written into the use of the preserve by the DEC. We have been good neighbors and Albany has recognized that. However, we do not take this for granted. We are active within the community sponsoring special events, have field cleanup days, and promote the outdoor activity of model flying in a family setting. The Edgewood Oak Brush Plains Preserve is a wonderful area of nature and fun outdoor activities for all to enjoy.

It has gotten so popular that it is packed on weekends. Numbers are being taken for all who come and participate so all can have a turn. The EWF also participated in a special event called, Fly-For-Tots. This is a children's charity fly-in event. This year many of our families participated in the event. They helped raised almost \$30,000 for the Fly-For-Tots program. All proceeds were donated to "Victory Junction" a special camp for troubled kids and teens as well as special needs children. We have also worked hard with the NYSDEC and the Friends of Edgewood in cleanup efforts as well as invasive removal. On Earth Day, we initiated a huge undertaking on removal of an invasive species know as the Autumn Olive. Over the course of the summer continued cutting and monitoring took place. Data was taken and compiled for continued removal over time. These events were done by the hard work and dedication of our members in order to continue to provide these activities for our community in a safe and great environment.



There are 3,000 like us in the US, 223 other organizations like the Edgewood Flyers in this country operate within Fish and Wildlife Reserves, Forest Preserves, Water Sheds and Reservoirs, Wetlands, and BLM Land. We continue to maintain the area and provide a clean and safe environment for our educational and developmental activities. We are thankful for the NYSDEC's help as well as for the members continued hard work.

AMA Scholarships...

Each year, the Academy of Model Aeronautics awards Charles Hampson Grant Scholarships to deserving high-school seniors who will be pursuing a continuing academic program at an accredited college or university.

Applications received are processed by a four-person selection committee and roughly \$50,000 annually is distributed in various amounts based on AMA modeling activities, scholastic achievement, and citizenship achievement.

To be eligible for a scholarship, the applicant must:

- Have been an AMA member for the last full 36 consecutive months prior to the April 30 application deadline
- Graduate from high school in the year in which the award is to be granted
- Have been accepted by a college or university offering a certificate or degree program

The Charles H. Grant Scholarship Program contains other grants which involve specific factors for determining the award.

The Toledo Weaks Signals Scholarship is awarded to the top recipient of the AMA/Charles H. Grant Scholarship.

The Telford Scholarship is based on participation in competition activity in the AMA and FAI classifications listed in the applicant packet.
